

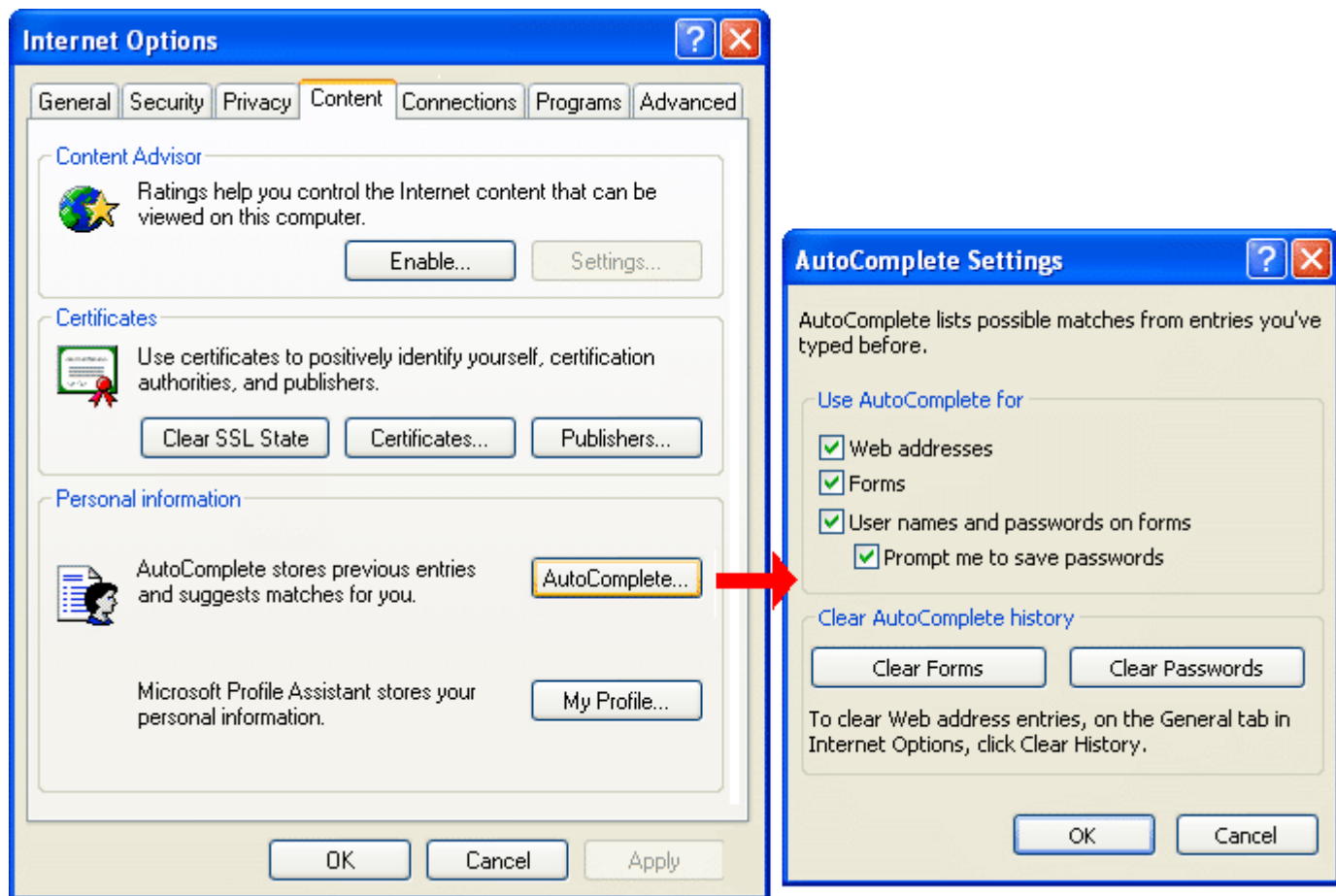
Setting up Auto Complete for Internet Explorer 6

Internet Explorer can remember certain details entered into online forms, such as usernames and passwords. To turn this option on or off, follow the instructions below. *Note:* These illustrations show Internet Explorer 6 in Windows XP.

Go to the **Tools** menu and select **Internet Options**.

A window will open like the one below. Click the **Content** tab, then click the **AutoComplete** button.

In the **AutoComplete Settings** window, check (or uncheck) the options you would like to use.



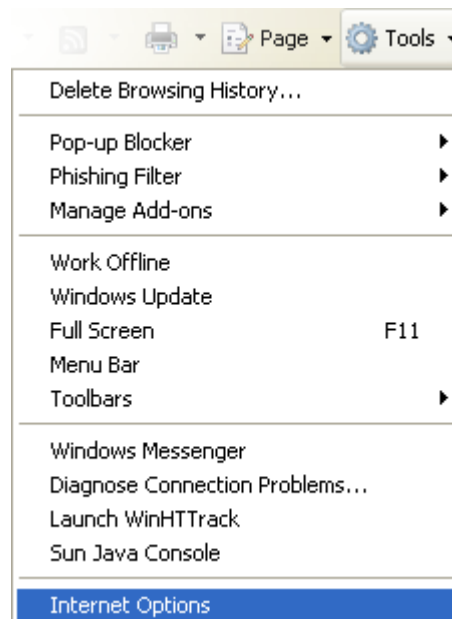
Ensure the **Forms** check box is ticked. Once ticked forms should remember what you previously entered.

Once you have set this up - clicking twice in any field will show previously entered details (such as drug name).

Setting up Auto Complete for Internet Explorer 7 & 8

Internet Explorer can remember certain details entered into online forms, such as usernames and passwords. To turn this option on or off, follow the instructions below. *Note:* These illustrations show Internet Explorer 7 & 8 in Windows XP.

- Click the **Tools** button (pictured right), then select **Internet Options**.
- Click the **Content** tab.
- Under **Autocomplete**, click the **Settings** button.
- Click the checkboxes to set the types of information you want Internet Explorer to remember.



Ensure the **Forms** check box is ticked. Once ticked forms should remember what you previously entered.

Once you have set this up - clicking twice in any field will show previously entered details (such as drug name).

Other Browsers (Firefox etc)

Auto Complete works with most browsers. If you use a different browser a Google search for “auto complete <your browser >” (replacing <your browser> with the browser name) will usually provide instructions.
